## AMERICAN BULLMASTIFF ASSOCIATION 1992 FAR WEST SPECIALTY

## SATURDAY, APRIL 25, 1992 Cypress College, Cypress, CA

This Specialty was the first Bullmastiff INDEPENDENT area Specialty held in the west. There have been four independent National Specialties held here prior to this. Having been show chairman for two of these I did not see any problem arising in doing an independent area specialty except for the possibility of an entry small enough to cause a deficit after all accounting was done. Silly me! The show itself was just fine. Dealing with some of the suppliers was the ULTIMATE lesson in Murphy's Law. Three days before the show we discovered the ring canopy we were going to use had been to severely damaged to use so last minute arrangements were made with a rental company. The superintendent's order for show ribbons got lost in the system. The ribbons (which were perfect) had to be made in 6 hours on the day before the show. The rental company that promised me they would absolutely have the tables and chairs at the show site by 6:45 AM managed to show up at 8:25, jsut 5 minutes before the show started. The trophies, boutique, and other sales had to wait until the last second to be set up.

Then we had the weather. While parts of the country were freezing under nearly winter conditions, we had the usual occurance for a Santa Ana Valley KC weekend. The temperature hit 90 degrees. Luckily we had some trees and canopies on site.

From that point on, everything went like clockwork. Most exhibitors didn't even know there had been any problems, with the exception of those who were foolish enough to ask me how things were going.

The ring was set up on a large grassy area behind the college gymnasium. Coffee and doughnuts were offered free of charge to all exhibitors. Lunch, consisting of a variety of sandwiches and salads, was catered, sodas were on sale all day. A raffle was held during the lunch hour.

Chief ring steward Laura Worsham and assistant ring steward Kathi Isenberg kept traffic moving in and out of the ring with exceptional smoothness. Dick Vail handled the public address system with his usual fine efficiency. Sally Ann Catering supplied our lunch. Scott Peterson was in charge of Grounds, Denyse Raskin was Catalog Advertising chairman, Brenda Gere and Linda Long were Boutique managers. Clint Carlisle was our official Show Photographer. Thanks also go to all the fanciers whose generosity and hard work made this show a success.

#### A WASH FOR SORE EARS

If your dog's ears show inflammation, tenderness or brown discharge, try Dr. J. C. Blumenthal's ear wash. Put 1 1/2 teaspoons boric acid powder and a few drops of dye (Gentian Violet is common) in a 4 ounce bottle. Fill the bottle the rest of the way with isopropyl alcohol.

If the dog's ear is full of hair, pull out as much as possible. Use Panalog<sup>R</sup> in the ear twice a day for a couple of days until the ear is no longer angry. Shake the ear wash well and pour a teaspoon or two into the dog's ear. With your hand cupped behind it, massage the ear gently for a minute. Do the other ear before you let the dog shake its head. ## BETTER LATE THAN NEVER

People say persistence usually pays off. Well, I would say breeding a bitch for 5 1/2 years every season but one and having her miss every time goes beyond the description of persistence. Stubborn is a word that comes to mind.

Having a bitch as lovely as Zoe was good enough for me, puppies or no. However, I just knew she was fertile and something was going wrong in the progress of the pregnancy. For the first few years she didn't give any indication of pregnancy after breeding. The last two, she would look in whelp for about four weeks, get milk, and then all signs of pregnancy would disappear.

I took her to a reproductive specialist. She had blood tests, took thyroxine, was douched, had vaginal smears taken by me daily for three weeks to track her progress into and through her season, took antibiotics before-during-after breeding. Her heat cycles were ALWAYS normal. Always, the same thing happened. She looked like she was in whelp until four weeks and then, POOF, it was all gone. She was ultra-sounded at three and a half weeks after each of her last four breedings. No puppies could be seen.

You might thing by now a reasonable person would give up on this bitch as a motherhood prospect. Not necessarily, because her prospective husband was her housemate, so it was not a difficult problem to breed her, and she was such a good bitch I felt that getting even one puppy from her was important.

In late November of last year, at 6 years and 9 months she came into season again. I took her to Dr. Barbara Reichel for Icagen testing to determine the correct time to breed her. We decided to do a fresh semen DIRECT IMPLANT into the uterus. This was going to be IT. Everything else had been tried and she was at the far end of the age at which I will breed a bitch.

On the proper day Zoe and Chisum visited Dr. Reichel's office. Chisum was collected and he and I went home. Zoe stayed, was put under anesthesia, a small incision was made in her abdomen and uterus. The doctor found she had endometriosis in one horn of the uterus but the other was perfectly normal. She implanted the semen. Four hours later Zoe came bouncing into the hospital reception room, paying absolutely no attention to the fact she'd just had surgery and had a couple of inches of stitches in her tummy. It was as if nothing had happened. Actually nothing bothers this bitch except toenail clipping, at which time she dissolves into a quivering, whimpering bowl of jello.

We suspected from the indications, that Zoe was getting in whelp, dropping her progesterone level below the point at which she could hold a pregnancy. After breeding the progesterone level must stay high or bitches absorb their pups.

Dr. Reichel took blood for a progesterone test at the time of the implant. Then Zoe was tested again a few weeks later. Her progesterone was within the safe range but not great. At 3 1/2 weeks an ultrasound was done to determine pregnancy. At the same time another progesterone test was done. At 2 1/2 weeks her progesterone level had been 17. This time it was 8. The ultra sound discovered one fetus. Immediately, Zoe was put on Provera, a progesterone supplement. Blood tests were done weekly for the next 3 weeks to check her levels. The test shows only the dog's own natural level. It does not read the supplement. If the test level is high the supplement can be stopped. However, in Zoe's case the 8 went to 4. She obviously was going to stay on the supplement. You might be wondering what all this wonderful treatment costs. This is one of those "If you have to ask, you can't

afford it." questions. Since I had invested a good deal of effort and money to get Zoe to full term pregnancy (Oh yes, time too -5 1/2 years), and this was her last chance, I decided she would have a caesarian section. All told one can figure somewhere between \$1200 and \$1500 from start to finish with a section included. I wasn't risking a problem delivery on this one. So---when her temperature went down, off we went to the doctor. At my regular vet's office I assist in my dog's sections. Here I had to sit in the waiting room. Talk about pacing the floor! I was absolutely sure this wasn't going to work out. I could not believe after all this time there was actually going to be a live Zoe baby. Dr. Reichel came out of surgery with this one pound dark red, black masked lump wrapped in a towel. For some reason I wasn't expecting something that dark. I just stared at it. I was also overwhelmed that there was actually a living puppy. Poor Dr. Reichel though I was disappointed. Actually, I was numb. Nine weeks of constant anxiety were over, or so I thought, and I was drained.

To top everything off, this was a bitch puppy. This was exactly what I wanted.

An hour later Zoe and I went home. Now came the fun part. Zoe was almost 7 years old. How was she going to adapt to a puppy. I soon found out. She went crazy over it. She practically washed the skin off it. I could not leave it with her because she was too fussy. I brought it back an hour later to nurse again and she was calmer. She thought it was very nice. But, when she decided to shift positions in the box, she didn't even look where the puppy was and kicked it clear across the box. That was enough for me. I could not sit in a whelping box every two hours for a half an hour at a time to keep the puppy safe while feeding, so I decided to bottle feed. The puppy like the formula, and Zoe settled down by the next morning and didn't seem to miss her.

After five days, I decided the pup wasn't gaining the way I had hoped. My brindle Maud had a litter of six, 13 days older than this pup. She had enough milk for 10 and adored pups. I thought I would try the pup with her. It was a feisty little devil, like her mom, not inclined to take no for an answer. Maud adored her. Maud's pups were huge, literally three times the size of Zoe's pup. That didn't deter the little one. She would grab a nipple and not let go no matter what. She would burrow her way between and under the big pups and push and shove until she got what she wanted.

I did notice she still was not gaining as fast as I would have liked. One evening when she was 3 weeks her breathing got very short and labored. In the morning the vet x-rayed her but nothing showed really clearly. Her forechest and ribs were not well sprung and he thought she might have a congenital defect. He sent me to an internal medicine specialist, who had exceptionally good x-ray equipment and was a genius in his field. I had originally thought the pup had pneumonia but nothing had shown on the first x-ray. This time it showed clearly that she did. Her chest was not expanding because she could not fully expand her lungs. She was put on chloramphenicol and within 24 hours was normal and back with the other pups. She stayed on medication for a week. At the end of two weeks she went back for a check up. She was totally well. You can add another \$300 to the cost of this pup.

Was it worth it? You bet! This baby has her father's structure. Her mother's expression and total joy of life. I can't say she was leash-broken in one lesson. It didn't take that long. I put a lead and collar on her and off we went. Just like her mom, she has no reverse gear.

Zoe's pup was a bonus. I always have been thrilled to own her. Thanks to the wonders of modern technology she carried to term. If your bitch looks in whelp and then stops midway, I suggest progesterone testing. It could mean the difference between having or not having a litter.

## LEARNING ABOUT CANINE BLOAT

It,s sudden. Your dog is playful and healthy one minute, and then you notice something is terribly wrong. An emergency visit to the veterinary hospital confirms your dog has bloat. "What caused such rapid change in my dog's health for him to go into shock?" you contemplate. Drs. Lawrence Glickman and Gary Lantz at Purdue University are leading a study they anticipate will bring new information to answer this question that has been perplexing scientists for years. The investigators will identify predisposing factors in high risk dogs so steps can be taken by owners and veterinarians to prevent bloat.

Canine gastric dilation-volvulus (CGDV), called bloat, is the rapid accumulation of gas in the stomach causing compression of surrounding organs. This results in shock and is fatal if medical care is available. Early intervention is essential in an attempt to save the dog's life. While all dogs are at risk, higher weight, purebred dogs like the Great Dane and Irish Wolfhound are believed to be at highest risk. Dogs that eat fast, exercise immediately before or after eating, and drink large amounts of water are thought to be more likely to get bloat. Physical characteristics thought to be associated with bloat include weight, a large, deep chest and perhaps breed.

The initial study involves obtaining information from the Veterinary Medical Data Program database, located at Purdue, from a ten-year period. Frequency, trends, physical characteristics and treatment methods are being compiled to identify commonalities between bloat patients.

Evaluating environmental factors of naturally-occurring bloat in pet dogs is the second phase. The collaboration of 30 veterinary practices will provide information about nearly 75 bloat patients. Analysis of nonbloated dogs of similar weight and breed will provide a control group comparison. Pet care including diet, exercise and health habits, and physical traits like chest size will be documented by participating veterinarians. Follow-up interviews with owners of bloat patients will supply recovery pet care and treatment specifics.

The outcome of this study, made possible through funding from Morris Animal Foundation, will give owners and veterinarians prevention information to reduce the occurrence of this often fatal disease. In addition, it will provide unique data to apply toward finding the cause for bloat and for the development of future research efforts.

## **RIGHT NOW RECIPES**

#### **MEATLESS LASAGNA**

Serves 8 - 10

1 large onion, chopped
2 cloves garlic, minced
1 eggplant, diced
1/4 lb. mushrooms, sliced
5 Tbsp salad oil
1 carrot, shredded
2 C. "Tomato with Bits" sauce (Hunts)

1/4 C. parsley, Minced

2 tsp oregano
1 tsp basil
salt & pepper to taste
1/2 cup dry red wine
10 lasagna noodles
2 cups Ricotta cheese (1 lb.)
8 oz. Mozzarella cheese, grated
1 1/2 C. Parmesan cheese, grated
(reserve 1/2 cup for top

Saute first 5 ingredients. Add next 7 ingredients and cook covered about 30 minutes. Cook and drain the lasagna noodles. Combine cheeses, then alternate layers of sauce, noodles and cheeses. Top with sauce and grated Parmesan. Bake at 350 degrees for 40 minutes. This dish can be made ahead and frozen.

## SCIENCE AND THE DOG

DOG WORLD, September 1991

#### CANINE HEART PROBLEMS

The most common signs of canine heart problems are exercise intolerance, shortness of breath and coughing. A problem can be confirmed with a veterinary examination and x-rays, an electrocardiaogram or an echocardiography.

A congenital heart defect common in puppies is patent ductus arteriosus, frequently seen in Poodles and Shelties. The connection between the two main arteries exiting the heart does not close, causing a telltale murmur. PDA is surgically correctable and has a 90 percent success rate if caught early.

Treatment for aortic stenosis--anarrowing of the aorta--is still in the experimental stages, but veterinarians are using balloon valvuloplasty, a human heart technique, to treat pulmonic stenosis.

A degenerating or "leaky" valve in the heart of an aging dog can cause the heart to enlarge. Medication can reduce fluid buildup and strengthen heart contractions. Large and giant breeds sometimes have dialted cardiomyopathy, in which the heart muscle can't contract to pump blood. Medicatoin can help control the disease, but most older dogs that develop this live only six months to two years.
